- **WELCOME / INTRODUCTIONS (Katy Liddell)**
- **ANNOUNCEMENTS**
  - Katy advised that our December meeting would be a repeat of last year – a holiday social at South Beach Café.
  - Gary announced that the MTA has confirmed that the speed limit on King/Embarcadero will be reduced from 35 to 30 mph, and the pedestrian crossing time on King Street at 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Streets will be increased. This is a direct result of the Traffic Calming petition that we submitted in June.
  - Jamie Whitaker reminded all about Voter Registration.
  - Matt Springer asked if anyone had heard about the 'party bus' that seems to be showing up more in the neighborhood. It's a noise nuisance.
- **AT&T PROJECT LIGHTSPEED**
  - Marc Blakeman of AT&T gave a brief presentation of their plans to upgrade their telecommunications network by installing above-ground boxes throughout the neighborhood (there are ten within or just outside our neighborhood boundaries). The locations are as follows: 575 First Street, 200 Brannan, Pier 40, 698 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, 700 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, 631 4<sup>th</sup> Street, 498 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, 99 Stillman, and 474 4<sup>th</sup> Street.
