- **WELCOME (Katy Liddell)**
- **SUNDAY STREETS**
 - Susan King of Sunday Streets announced that due to the growing success of these events in 2009, the number will increase from 6 events this year to 9 events in 2010. First event is March 14th from Fisherman's Wharf to Mission Bay (Mariposa/16th Streets). Add'l events in 2010 include 1 or 2 in Bayview, 2 in the Mission, 2 at the Great Hwy, plus the Tenderloin and Western Addition. Sunday Streets is now a permanent event in SF with the goal to be one per month. Volunteers are needed! For more info, go to www.SundayStreetsSF.com
- **NEW PARK IN RINCON HILL**
 - Corinne Woods, Chairperson of the Mission Bay CAC, as well as a long-time resident and advocate for our neighborhood, asked everyone to 'spread the word' about the new park coming to Rincon Hill (Harrison at Fremont Street). A Dec 8th planning meeting is scheduled and all interested residents are urged and encouraged to attend and participate.
- **ENTRIPS**
 - Peter Cohen and Andrew Hyder, community planning consultants, spoke about the **Eastern Neighborhood Transportation Implementation Planning Study**, a partnership between SFMTA, the SF Planning Dept, and the SF County Transportation Authority to address multiple transportation modes (transit, bikes, pedestrians, autos, etc) and their impact on the growing Eastern Neighborhoods over the next 20 years. - **HIGH SPEED RAIL**
 - Gia Daniller from the High Speed Rail Authority and Kim Rothschild from Caltrain discussed the High Speed Rail project already in the works for CA. The proposed main route is SF to LA (less than 2hrs 40mins travel time), with eventual extensions south to San Diego and east to Sacramento. This is a 'priority' project due to the growing population and already-crowded airports and freeways. This is the largest public/private project in US history with benefits for the economy and the environment. Within the Bay Area, from SF to SJ (30 minutes travel time), Caltrain is continuing its work on electrification of its system. Details not yet confirmed as to where the HSR will terminate in SF (4th/King Caltrain Station? The new Transbay Transit Center? Beale Street?). No completion date given.
