- **WELCOME / INTRODUCTIONS (Katy Liddell)**
- **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

- **CONGESTION PRICING / TRANSPORTATION PLAN**
 - Zabe Bent, Principal Transportation Planner from the SF County Transportation Authority, gave a slide presentation on the Transportation plan for the next 25 years. Congestion Pricing will help fund some of the long term transportation projects. The project looks at all aspects (car, bike, bus train) and has four overall goals: to make SF a livable city, to create a healthy environment, to build a world-class infrastructure, and to strengthen our city's economic competitiveness. The focus is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Is it feasible to meet goals? What are the benefits/impacts? There is still a need for funding analysis and an EIR. Potential implementation is 2015.
