- **WELCOME / INTRODUCTIONS (Katy Liddell)**
- **ANNOUNCEMENTS**
  - Michael Anthony reminded all of this week's Sunday Streets. Interested residents will be meeting to walk from The Embarcadero to Bayview, and then grab some lunch afterwards at Tres Agaves. Organized by the NA Social Committee.

  - Gary Pegueros reminded all of our Yahoo Group. He's also organizing a Self Defense Class (details to be confirmed). The CA High Speed Rail Authority advised that Beale Street has been removed as a possible terminus. KFOG's KaBoom is scheduled for Saturday May 22<sup>nd</sup> at Candlestick Point (it will no longer be held at Piers 30/32).
- **CLEAN POWER SF**
  - Jason Fried from City Hall spoke about Clean Power SF, a soon-to-be alternate choice in selecting the source of our power from PGE. Currently PGE's electricity is generated from nuclear, coal, natural gas, hydroelectric and other sources. Clean Power SF will generate electricity from increasingly clean and more renewable resources like solar, wind, and others. Followed by Q&A.
- **THE COST OF PEDESTRIAN INJURIES**
  - Dahianna Lopez, Prevention Director SF Injury Center from UCSF, gave an interesting presentation on the cost of pedestrian injuries. Since 2003, there have been 650-750 vehicular-pedestrian collisions per year in SF. 81-93 per 100K people in SF are killed annually per year, higher than anywhere else in the US. Of SF's 11 Supervisory Districts, our District 6 accounts for approx 20% of admitted patients due to these collisions. Followed by Q&A.
