- **WELCOME / INTRODUCTIONS** (Katy Liddell)
- **Meeting updates**
- Katy spoke of the D6 Pedestrian Safety Committee, facilitated by Sunny Angulo of Jane Kim's office, which meets on the 1st Monday of each month at 5:30p at City Hall. She invited any interested resident to join them.
- A meeting on the Rincon Hill Streetscape Plan is scheduled for 6p on 5/13 at the South Beach Harbor Community Room.
- Corinne announced that the 5/14 Mission Bay CAC will include a presentation by the Giants on their Seawall Lot A proposal. 5p at the Mission Creek Senior Center.
- Bruce Agid invited all to join him at the next South Beach D6 Democratic Club meeting scheduled for 5/18 at 7p at 1180 4th St, Mercy Housing Community Room. Agenda includes traffic issues in SoMa (Muni, BART, Caltrain).

- **Vision Zero**
- Mari Hunter of the SFMTA and Nicole Ferrara, Executive Director of Walk SF, spoke about the Vision Zero Policy adopted in February 2014 whose mission is to get to 'zero' traffic fatalities/serious injuries by 2024. This originated in Sweden and is being adopted by many cities around the world and the US. VZ is endorsed by Mayor Ed Lee and supported by over 40 community groups in San Francisco.
- How do they plan to achieve this? There are several strategies: **Education:** educating drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists on proper behavior. **Enforcement:** policing/tickets. **Engineering:** traffic calming, improved crosswalks, signals, bulb-outs. **Evaluation:** measuring progress throughout the process.
- 70% of severe/fatal injuries occur on 12% of San Francisco street miles (does not include freeways).
