A CONVERSATION WITH DISTRICT 6 SUPERVISOR MATT HANEY

Supervisor Haney returned for his annual visit with our residents. He began with a recap of some of the issues he and his team have been addressing in our district:

- Opening of the Warriors Arena with minimal community impacts
- Getting the Mission Bay Dog Park opened, as well as new streets accepted by the City
- Opening of the Embarcadero Safe Navigation Center with defined safety and outreach zones, enhanced policing with two foot-beat officers, metrics for evaluating community impacts over time. 50 clients taken in thus far
- A 10-point Clean Downtown Program (our area included) which features 100 Big Belly trash containers (mostly in the 8 CBD areas in D6 due to their maintenance capabilities) and power-washing at key sites
- Working with Recology on dumpsters and upgrading trash receptacles
- Pedestrian Safety adding more PCO's to help manage the busier intersections
- Mental Health SF, co-authored with Supervisor Ronen, focusing on mental health issues and the drug use crisis / open-air drug dealing
- More effective support for unsheltered people legislation pending to have Navigation Centers built in every SF district
- Rincon Hill Dog Park clean-up and security
- Mission Bay School—pushing to keep the new school board members focused on getting the school open (the opening has been delayed by 2 years – now 2025)
- Central Subway (opening is now scheduled for Summer 2021) interested in improving transparency
