A CONVERSATION WITH SFPD Southern Station Captain Ed Del Carlo

- Captain Del Carlo joined Southern Station as our Captain about 3 months ago. He was born and raised in SF and has been with the SFPD for 29 years and with the City for 31 years. He spoke briefly about our district with regards to crimes and other information:
 - Auto Burglaries are down
 - Robberies remain steady, but mostly in the 6th Street corridor
 - Most crimes occur between 3rd and 9th Streets, from Mission to Brannan. Mission Street is the border between the Southern and Tenderloin districts so the two work closely together
 - Homelessness continues to be an issue with no quick fix; two Navigation Centers recently opened at 5th/Bryant and South Van Ness/Division Streets
 - The Captain recently met with the head of Security at the Warriors Chase Arena. He anticipates issues with traffic, parking, and security as they open; the SFPD is partnering with the Warriors and will help work thru these issues. Chase Arena will have a soft opening in August, and ramp up in September
- Followed by Q&A from the residents in attendance. Topics/questions included:
 - Homeless encampment at the Brannan Street Wharf seems to have been cleaned up over the past few months
 - 350 Bryant Street (near 2nd Street) continues to have issues with homeless encampments. The Captain will set up an onsite meeting for a walkthrough.
 - A resident of The Clocktower (2nd at Bryant Streets) spoke of the ongoing traffic congestion issues at that intersection during the afternoon/evening commute (loud honking, blocking the box, aggressive drivers)
 - The Captain suggested residents get the 3-1-1 app to report crimes and issues; and to also call the Southern Station.
 - A few residents praised the SFPD for all the great work they do to support our community
