- **WELCOME + INTRODUCTIONS** (Alice Rogers)
- **Embarcadero Connectivity Plan**  
Keith Tanner and Casey Leedom, planners with the SFMTA, presented this just-launched process in order to get feedback from residents. With the SF Port working on a draft plan to address sea-level rising and seismic activity, this two-year plan is to develop a long-range transportation master plan along the northeastern waterfront. Once the Port begins the phased construction along the Embarcadero, what will the transportation system look like? What transportation changes are needed to implement as the Port project moves through its various phases? How will adjacent neighborhoods be impacted? The program will consider near-term priorities and long-term visions and policies. Followed by Q&A.

- **Speed Safety Cameras**  
Justin Horng, Transportation Planner for the SFMTA, presented on this program coming next year. (SF is one of six CA cities implementing this program.) 33 cameras are planned for San Francisco, distributed throughout the city based on studies showing high-injury streets and neighborhoods with vulnerable road users. 7 of the 33 cameras are proposed for District 6. This program is intended to slow down cars and ultimately save lives. Justin explains how the cameras and program will work. Next step is for the Board of Supervisors to approve the RFP selection. Cameras to be installed in early 2025. Followed by Q&A.
