TOPIC A conversation with SFPD Southern Station Captain Amy Hurwitz

- **Welcome and Introductions** (Alice Rogers)
- A conversation with SFPD Southern Station Captain Amy Hurwitz
 Captain Amy Hurwitz and Sergeant Dion McDonnell of SFPD Southern Station
 joined us. Captain Hurwitz has been with the SFPD for over 20 years as a patrol
 officer and plainclothes officer, and has served as a Lieutenant, Sergeant, and
 Captain working variously in the Tenderloin, Richmond, Central, Southern,
 Northern and Ingleside Stations plus the Chase Center. Already a Captain at
 Ingleside, she became the commanding officer of Southern Station in July 2025.

Captain Hurwitz discussed several topics including:

- Staffing Levels SFPD, if fully staffed, should have 1,976 officers; currently we are short by 600
- Calling 911 if you dial 911 from your cell, you will likely reach the CHP; instead dial (415) 553-8090. For non-emergency matters, dial (415) 553-0123
- The best way to generate a call record, which the police can then trail, respond, and follow up, is to call the 911/311 dispatcher, or use the 311 app.
- The Safeway at King Street has the highest theft rate of any store. At
 Ingleside Station, they were able to reduce theft at their Safeway. Captain will
 coordinate with the Sergeant of Ingleside to train the Southern Station officers
 on running their operations to reduce theft
- Captain is working to establish a 24/7 contact person for the Nav Center
- **Police redistricting** will provide any updates when info is available.
- The **best advice for residents** who want to 'do more' is to remain vocal, contact Southern Station and Supervisor Dorsey's office regarding matters they can help address; when contacting 911/311, report only factual descriptions without downplaying the situation or embellishments.
- To proactively safeguard homes/businesses against crime, engage with the SFPD Neighborhood Safety Team; services and scope here.
- Captain touched on various other topics including homeless encampments, new technology (drones, flock cameras), being a sanctuary city, and more.
