A conversation with Assemblyman Matt Haney

Previously our District 6 Supervisor from 2019 to 2022, and prior to that a Commissioner on the SF Board of Education, Matt succeeded David Chiu in the CA State Assembly District 17 (when Chiu became SF's City Attorney). Matt spoke of the many committees and issues he's involved with, focusing on some of the most pressing matters such as drug use, treatment, recovery, and supportive housing. Downtown recovery is also a top priority. Office conversion to housing (or other use) and building more housing are a priority, as well as supporting small businesses, removing bureaucratic approval hurdles, and supporting entertainment zones in appropriate areas.

Embarcadero Navigation Center - Proposed Extension (35:30 marker) Dylan Schneider, Manager of Legislative Affairs for the San Francisco Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH), began by reviewing the numbers of unhoused in SF vs. the number of beds and resources. The Embarcadero Navigation Center opened in December 2019. Five Keys is the non-profit operator. The current MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) between HSH and the Port expires December 31, 2025. It includes a 2-year option to extend through December 31, 2027. As the Port anticipates development on Seawall Lot 330 to begin by mid-2027, and the Navigation Center program needs about 6 months to wind down (move guests to other facilities, demobilize the physical site), it is estimated that the Embarcadero Navigation Center would close by the end of 2026. HSH will present its proposal to the Port Commission Nov. 18. To meet the needs and concerns of the neighbors, SFPD is using volunteer overtime patrols as available 7 days a week from 11a to 9p. SFPD will also provide two Community Ambassadors Monday through Friday 10a to 8p. Five Keys will also provide a dedicated cleaning service in the area with hourly perimeter walks and volunteer cleaning groups. Five Keys will newly provide Neighborhood Ambassadors daily 6a
